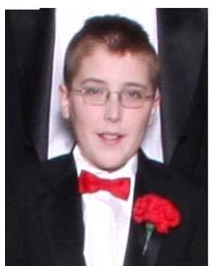

In September, Kyle is entering his sophomore year at Penfield High School and hopes to one day own a restaurant. He is a tireless CF Foundation fundraiser and recently raised over \$5,000 by implementing fundraisers at Penfield schools.

Cystic Fibrosis and the CF Foundation

Cystic Fibrosis (CF) is a life-threatening disease and is the most common genetic disease in America.

- Approximately 30,000 people in the United States have active CF
- Over 10 million people -- 1 in 30 Americans -- are silent carriers of the gene that causes CF
- CF creates thickening of the mucus in the lungs making it difficult to breathe and can also block the digestive tract and pancreas creating significant nutritional issues
- The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation has fueled dramatic improvements in research and care that have significantly changed the prognosis for people with CF
- In 1955, children born with CF often died before reaching elementary school. Today, the predicted median age of survival for people with CF is more than 37 years
- To quicken the pace of drug discovery and development, the Foundation has pioneered an innovative and highly effective business model using the same results-driven approach of a for-profit company. The Foundation has committed hundreds of millions of dollars in collaboration with the biotech industry to fuel the search for new treatments and a cure
- The Foundation's unique approach to drug discovery has yielded a therapeutics pipeline with more than 30 potential therapies in development for CF
- The Foundation is one of the most effective and efficient organizations of its kind. B. CEPACIA POLICY: Because of risks to people with CF, individual with a confirmed positive sputum culture for *Burkholderia cepacia* complex shall not attend this event. This is because *B. cepacia* can be passed between individual who have CF through close proximity. *B. cepacia* infection in a person with CF can cause serious respiratory illness and, in some patients, may lead to death. Despite this policy, there still might be some individuals with *B. cepacia* in attendance. *B. cepacia* is not a risk for otherwise healthy individuals.
