

The Founders Club Dress Code

Golf

Appearance is a direct reflection of the quality of Members at The Founders Club. We ask that Members dress appropriately as is customary at many traditional clubs.

- 1) Members are responsible in communicating the Club's dress code to their guests and family members.
- 2) **Men**-golf shirts with collars and sleeves, golf turtlenecks or mock turtlenecks, and slacks or Bermuda shorts of mid-thigh length are considered appropriate. Tank tops, tee shirts, mesh shirts, sweat pants, warm-up pants, blue jeans/denim, swim wear, short shorts, cutoffs, gym shorts, tennis outfits or other athletic shorts are not permitted. Shirt tails should be tucked in at all times.
- 3) **Ladies**-Dresses, skirts, slacks, mid-length shorts and blouses are considered appropriate attire. Halter tops, tee shirts, cut-offs, sweat pants, warm-up suits, blue jeans/denim, swim wear, tennis dresses, short shorts, or other athletic shorts are not permitted.
- 4) Gentlemen are asked to refrain from wearing hats/caps in the Clubhouse/Dining Areas (this includes the verandah). Caps are to be worn brim facing forward.
- 5) Soft Spike/Spikeless golf shoes are mandatory.

Golf Hall

- 1) Members are responsible in communicating the Club's dress code to their guests and families.
- 2) Shorts and Golf Attire are allowed in the Grille and Veranda during dinner service.
- 3) Long pants are required for gentlemen in the Main Dining Room after 6:00pm between November-April. Bermuda shorts are accepted in the Main Dining Room for dinner in the Summer Season months of May-October.
- 4) No jeans/denim, cutoffs or t-shirts or other inappropriate golf attire (Refer to Golf Attire Section) are allowed except in specific events promoted by the club. Turtlenecks or mock-turtleneck golf shirts are allowed.
- 5) Gentlemen are asked to refrain from wearing hats/caps in the Clubhouse/Dining Areas (this includes the verandah). Caps are to be worn brim facing forward.
